A FAMILY OF MISSIONARY DISCIPLES

St. John Paul famously said that "the future of evangelization depends in great part on the Church of the home". As a domestic church, your family is called to radiate the love of Christ to the world by guarding, revealing, and communicating love through both word and witness of life. In this talk couples will learn from Scripture, the teaching of the Church, and the lives of the Saints how to encounter the love of Christ anew with their families, so as be forth as joyful proclaimers of the Gospel of Life and of the Family.
