THE DIGNITY OF THE PERSON

Sister Terese Auer, OP, PhD

This presentation will address the origins of human dignity, why human life is considered sacred, and how this dignity impacts medical care. There will be theological, philosophical, and natural law principles which assist the speaker in drawing these conclusions.

GENDER DYSPHORIA IN CHILDREN AND ADULTS: SCIENCE, IDEOLOGY AND ETHICS

This presentation will discuss medical psychosocial realities of gender dysphoria and identify anthropological and medical basis for medical and psychological interventions. It will consider medical outcomes of puberty suppression and gender reassignment and whether these interventions are in keeping with medical data and best patient outcomes.

THE HEALTH CARE WORKER IN AN ERA OF SECULAR MEDICAL ETHICS

This presentation will describe the challenges of a Christian healthcare provider in serving the whole person in an era of secular medical ethics. It will identify means of maintaining the integrity of faith and reason in the current cultural environment, and consider ways for the medical professional to maintain a proper lived understanding of freedom and conscience in the face of a secularized medical ethic.

SOLIDARITY AND SUBSIDIARITY

It will consider how patient care and communication with patients and their families is improved by a commitment to solidarity and subsidiarity.

MORAL DECISION-MAKING: PROPORTIONATE AND DISPROPORTIONATE CARE

This presentation will define proportionate and disproportionate and provide specific examples. It will identify the weaknesses of the language of futility in decision making, and describe the criteria used to determine whether a treatment is morally obligatory (proportionate) or morally optional (disproportionate).
