THE HOUSEHOLD OF GOD AND YOUR HOUSEHOLD: WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO BE A DOMESTIC CHURCH?

The Second Vatican Council taught that "the family is, so to speak, the domestic church" (Lumen gentium, 11). This foundational presentation will explore the origin and significance of the "domestic church" based upon the thought of St. John Paul II, Scripture, and the witness of the saints. This talk will emphasize how understanding the identity and mission of the family as the domestic church is essential for the renewal of our culture, society, and the Church.
