HOPE AND THE REDEMPTIVE MEANING OF SUFFERING Roland Millare, STD

This presentation will discuss the meaning of human suffering and how health care professionals can walk with patients through it. It will explore the role of hope and how to foster it appropriately within the patients and families served. It will evaluate how narrative medicine can assist in accompanying patients and being a compassionate presence in the midst of suffering.

This presentation will provide information about the importance of spiritual preparation for the end of a person's life, assisting the individual and family to move with peace, comfort and love into the final stage of life here on earth. It will identify specific measures which can assist patients to embrace peace and discuss the advantages and disadvantages of advance planning documents for future medical needs.

CARE FOR THE HEALTH CARE PROFESSIONAL Rev. Columba Thomas OP, MD

This presentation will inform health care professionals of the importance of securing their own health, clarifying the truth of what it means to be human. It will describe the truth of the body, the mind, and the spirit, and religion's role in upholding the dignity of the whole person. It will also discuss how "healing thyself" must take place within a genuine relationship between patients and physicians, and physicians with peers.

A VIRTUOUS APPROACH TO VACCINE DEVELOPMENT AND USE OF VACCINES Gwyneth Anne Spaeder, MD

This presentation will offer an overview of the importance of vaccines and vaccine development from a medical, legal, and ethical perspective. It will consider the legal right and responsibilities of the state and individual relative to vaccination in light of virtue and the common good. It will also discuss the topic of moral cooperation in relationship to development and use of vaccines.
