EDUCATING IN CHRIST: PARENTS AS PRIMARY TEACHERS OF THEIR CHILDREN IN THE FAITH John & Claire Grabowski, Catholic Authors and Speakers

What happens if I go all-in as a believer and disciple of Jesus Christ? Is it even necessary or possible "to be made worthy of the promises of Christ?" It's unfair, but easier, to judge the truth of the Faith by the witness of Christians who betray, fail, or compromise. It seems more just, but harder, to judge by the heroic witness of those who live it to the full. These are the saints: ordinary men, women, and children made holy by God through their heroic faith in Him and His Church. Their witness is for us.
